The Centre for Jewish Life, located in the West End, is the only Jewish community space in Central London, that is not a synagogue. Located just yards away from Bond Street station, served by the Jubilee and Central lines, the Centre could not be better placed to attract young Jews who live or work across the city. With a cafeteria, lounge, meeting room and library, it is the perfect place for business people to meet, socialise and connect.

Founded in 2008, the Centre is dedicated to providing social, educational and business events for young unaffiliated Jews of all

backgrounds and nationalities, enabling them to connect with each other and their heritage.

The Centre is a hub for young adults, predominantly those in their twenties and thirties. It is a place where they can come together, connect with each other, in a non-judgmental, relaxed environment.

Our success can be evidenced by the weight of numbers. In just under three years, close to five thousand people have come through our doors. The vast majority of them had no previous or existing affiliation to anything Jewish and forty percent were young Jews from abroad living in the UK.

A diverse programme of events facilitated by a dedicated team in a welcoming and warm atmosphere is what sets the Centre apart. Our ability to inspire young people in the beauty and joy of Jewish life, the richness of a Jewish identity, and to empower them to pursue a personal journey and to make a difference in the lives of others is what enables us to connect.

Every Jew, no matter how observant or affiliated is equal. Our greatest priority is to help them reconnect. To make this happen on the scale required to revitalise Jewish life and the Jews of London we must continue to grow. To do this we need you to connect with us.

Lord Justice Rix:

I have a deep commitment to both Judaism and Jewishness, and the Jewish experience, and I'm a Jew in a world which has not been kind to Jews and has made it difficult to be a Jew. Speaking for myself in my life, I'm clear, in my mind, that I don't want to be the break in the chain, this wonderful chain that goes back to the beginnings of Judaism. And I'm immensely proud to be part of that chain for all kinds of reasons, for negative reasons and for positive reasons, the negative reasons because people have tried to prevent

my ancestors and me living a Jewish life. I think that Judaism is the most wonderful creation – I would use creation in the Jewish sense of creation of course – about how to live a life, teach a life to be lived to future generations. It is spiritual, it is pragmatic, it is evolutionary, it believes in life, it does not believe in dogma; I think these are wonderful things.

Yes, I think my dad for sure. He gave me a lot of values, and so when you think about a hero or a role model, that's what I think about. It is the values of Judaism, to be yourself, stand up for what you really think, protect your children and your family, and make sure that you reach some sort of balance. Work is important, but it's not all of it. And I think when you are immersed in something, thinking that I need to move onto the next stage, and I need to do this and that, you have the sense that that's the most important thing that

you can do. I've been there, let me tell you. I've been there, that's why I know exactly how it feels. But at the end of the day, when you look back, you know, you just have to have some distance. That's hard to do and hard to assess when you're really ambitious and you are really working hard.


