It is with this in mind, that a most fundamental and beautiful part of our tradition, is the relationship we have with our children. In remembering the exodus from Egypt, which more than any other event, continues to shape and inspire us as Jews, we are told to listen to our children. For it is only then that we will understand the story.

So, next time we are confused or afraid by things going on in the big world outside of us, listen carefully to children. Enter their world, for it is the only way to come back home to a place where there is both clarity and security and in turn we can share that serenity with the world outside.
